Membership and Club Development

The key to District strength and sustainability is steady membership growth over time. Rotary District 5220 membership leaders are committed to utilizing all the tools available to achieve these sustainability and growth outcomes. Utilizing these tools will promote effective leadership, encourage innovative practices to drive increased membership in existing clubs. These tools facilitate growth and development of new clubs with the primary goal of recruiting new members while retaining existing members. Vibrant clubs build a culture of enhanced Service Above Self and a fulfilling Rotary membership experience for all.

GOAL 1

Develop innovative ideas to increase membership in District 5220

Objective 1: Develop five (5) membership sectors in the District, each led by a sector membership advisor who builds relationships with and supports clubs while working in conjunction with the District Membership Chair.

- South Valley Sector: Atwater, Chowchilla, Oakhurst, Oakhurst Sierra, Livingston, Madera Sunrise, Madera, Mariposa-Yosemite, Winton-Nuevo, Merced, Merced Sunrise, Turlock, Turlock Sunrise.
- Central Valley Sector: Ripon, Salida, Ceres, Escalon Sunrise, Modesto, Modesto Gateway, Modesto Maharlika, Modesto Sunrise, Modesto Metro, Modesto Flex, Oakdale, Oakdale Sunrise.
- North Valley Sector: Stockton, Stockton Sunrise, North Stockton, Stockton Central, Stockton Pacific, Lodi, Lodi Sunrise, Lodi-Tokay, Galt.
- I-5 Corridor (West Valley): Tracy, Tracy Sunrise, Mountain House, Manteca, Manteca Morning, Los Banos, Patterson, Newman, Gustine, Lathrop.
- Gold Country: San Andreas, Groveland, Angels-Murphys, Arnold, Twain Harte, Sonora, Sonora Sunrise, Sonora 49er, West Calaveras.

Objective 2: Attract and train five (5) membership sector advisors.

- The Immediate Past District Governor, current District Governor line, and the Membership Chair select a membership sector advisor from each of the five areas.
- Sector advisors, both volunteers and recruits, are accepted based upon their knowledge of developing membership, their passion for growing Rotary membership, and their willingness to invest time to develop strong relationships with the Rotary clubs within their sector.
- V Sector advisors become the foundation of the membership team, along with the District Membership Chair who is the principal leader among them.

GOAL 2

Develop and plan sector training sessions utilizing a published membership plan and training program for the membership team and club membership committees.

Objective 1: Provide training for the membership team by the Rotary Zone 26/27 membership leaders.

- Education for the membership team, current DG line, and AGs as provided by the Zone membership leaders.
- Encourage clubs in to share new ideas and current effective membership development plans.
- Develop a District membership plan manual based upon information compiled from available sources in both print and digital formats.
- Sector advisors will provide personalized training sessions for club presidents, presidents-elect, and membership chairs in their sector using training concepts and materials that are available to them.
- The cost of sector training may be funded by the District
- Reimbursement may be requested by the district membership team for travel expenses.

Objective 2: Offer additional educational sessions, such as membership development and effective leadership. These sessions are scheduled throughout the Rotary year. The breakout sessions at district assemblies may include:
